In a letter to principals of parochial schools in the Dioof Miami, Msgr. William AcKeever, superintendent of schools, warned teachers to deal directly with the company in all transactions.

Advising Catholic school officials in Florida, Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi and Louisiana, the company noted that it "does not employ subscription agents or agencies. No one is authorized to collect money in payment for subscriptions to the Young Catholic Messenger, Our Little Messenger or Treasure

They urged school officials not to give money to any person representing himself as an agent of the Geo. A. Pflaum, Publishers, Inc.

### \* YOUR INCOME TAX \* French Catholic Schools Sign **Contracts For State Aid**

PARIS (NC) - More than 10,000 private schools in France - nearly all of them Catholic have taken advantage of state aid offered them under France's new school law.

Almost all the 11,400 private schools in France are Catholic. The rest are Jewish, Protestant or secular.

The law offering financial aid to private schools became effective this academic year.

In August the six cardinals

of the French Hierarchy counseled primary level Catholic schools, attended by students age 6 to 14, to negotiate "simple contracts" with the state. Under this plan the schools receive state aid in return for a limited amount of govern ment control.

Under the law, private schools also have the options of remaining without state control and without state aid, or of becoming a part of the public school system, with all expenses paid and full state control.

Even those schools that reject state aid are to receive aditional indirect state aid under the new law through increased financial help to parents of school children. The parents turn this money over to the schools.

### Religious Freedom Guarantee Text Adopted By UN Group

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (NC) - A text designed to guarantee freedom of thought, conscience and religion has been unanimously adopted by the United Nations General Assembly's Third Committee, which deals with social and human rights matters.

The text will form Article 18 of the proposed covenant or treaty on civil and political rights. Together for a proposed companion treaty on economic and social rights, it has been under U.N. consideration for 12 years.

These human rights covenants are intended to give legal force to the principles contained in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, adopted by the General Assembly in

# Around the clares that everyone "shall

have the right to freedom of thought, conscience and religion," including the "right to have or adopt a religion or belief of his choice."

Also guaranteed in the text is "freedom, either individually or in community with others and in public or private, to manifest his religion or belief in worship, observance, practice and teaching."

No one is to be subjected to coercion that will impair this freedom, the text declares. States which are parties to the covenant "undertake to have respect for the liberty of parents and, where applicable, legal guardians, to ensure the religious and moral education of their children in conformity with their convictions."

The Soviet representative, Valentin Sapzhnikov, after outlining the "freedom of religious worship" enjoyed in the Soviet Union, argued t would be "strange in unis present era of atomic energy and space travel" to persecute those holding "scientific views" and "professing non-religious beliefs."

When the article-by-article review of the covenants is completed - a process expected to take several years - both proposed treaties must go before the General Assembly for approval. After that they will be submitted to governments for ratification.

## Refugee Aid Goes On

The action of the Federal Government in allocating one million dollars to be used to benefit the Cuban refugees is official recognition of the seriousness of the problem in this area. Local groups and sympathetic individuals who have been trying desperately to cope with the complex problems of uprooted, homeless, discouraged people have rejoiced at this long-awaited help-

It was made clear by the President's press secretary that the appropriation is intended to supplement aid from other sources — foundations, charitable organizations, corporations and individuals.

No group is more keenly aware of the critical situation here than the Diocese of Miami. Many people have had good reason to admire the foresight shown in the building and staffing of the Spanish Center in downtown Miami long before the flight of refagees to these friendly shores began to pose a problem for the whole community.

The officials of Catholic Relief Services, who have had considerable experience in similar activities sponsored by the Bishops' Relief Committee, will work closely with the appointment of our Most Reverend Bishop in administering a share of this appropriation. The same zeal and efficiency that has characterized the work of the Spanish Center will go into this more complete program of relief.

The plight of the refugees, even though they are in our midst, remains somewhat difficult for us to imagine. Only a few of us have experienced the horror of having to leave home and possessions in a hurry; few know the bitterness of seeing the work of a lifetime collapse in a short time. Our hearts go out to these suffering people who want only to be able to return to a free Cuba and live normal lives again.

The Diocese will continue to work and plan and sacrifice along with all other interested groups to aid the refugees spiritually and materially.

# Your Pledge Counts

The recent disturbing report of the American Bishops' committee on the marked increase in objectionable films this past year lends a more serious note than ever to the pledge of the Legion of the Decency which will be taken at Mass this Sunday in all our churches.

The Legion exists to give moral appraisals of motion pictures. It is meant to be a guide for individuals and families in selecting entertainment that does not violate standards of Christian morality. Its critics are competent judges who are free to express their own views and interested only in honest, fair appraisals.

No one should take this pledge without understanding its meaning. The purpose of this public promise is to promote what is good in motion pictures and to discourage what is immoral and indecent. One accomplishes this by good example, by avoiding films listed as objectionable; by counseling those under one's care and influence to stay away from such movies; by refusing to patronize those theaters which regularly show indecent entertainment

The pledge reminds us that it is not enough for us to harp on the responsibility that movie producers have of avoiding excesses. We cannot blame the film-makers alone for avoiding their duty to the public. We have to blame ourselves if we have shirked responsibility in doing our part to secure decency in films.

When we carry out the pledge and leave empty seats in a theater, we are imposing the most powerful and the most desirable form of censorship on films. Moreover we are striking the greedy producers where they are most sensitive — in the

#### UNFORTUNATE LANGUAGE

### Top Court Ought To Revise Ruling Of McCollum Case

By JOSEPH A. BREIG

Something has come up that moves me to return for a moment to the subject of the public schools and religious and moral literacy.

Two months ago, double sessions were instituted in the Dunkirk, N.Y., high school because of a problem of classroom space.

As a result, it became temporarily impossible to go on releasing students for off - the premises religious education.

#### MINISTER OBJECTS

The Dunkirk Council of (Protestant) Churches and the city's five Catholic pastors therefore recommended ethical guidance and character development

The superintendent of schools and the Board of Education concurred, and the courses became part of the curriculum. A Unitarian minister, however, objected. He appealed to the New York State Board of Education.

The State Board's legal division thereupon outlawed the character - ethics program on the ground that it violated the U.S. Supreme Court's McCollum ruling.

CASE REVIEWED

The McCollum ruling, you will remember, was handed down in 1948 in a case originating in the public schools of Champaign,

The complaint was brought by a professed atheist mother who said her sen was embarrassed because she would not let him go to any of the released - time religious education classes which other students volunarily elected to attend.

The Supreme Court-ruled that the released - time courses were unconstitutional if given on school property, or if attendance records or anything of the sort were kept by school employes.

The court did not let it go at that. Instead, it uttered an unfortunate metaphor about a "high and impregnable wall of separation between church and

Had the court pursued the logic of its language, eventually it would have had to outlaw chaplains in the armed forces and in Congress, and similar practices going back to the foundations of the Republic.

The court, however, modified its terminology in a subsequent decision in New Jersey, in which it ruled that bus rides at public expense for pupils in church - affiliated schools are constitu-

Nevertheless, the mischief for which the language of the Mc-Collum decision opened the door continues to crop up.

The whole field of moral obligation and moral beauty the field of human nobility - is closed by this ruling to New York State public schools.

They may instruct young women in cake-baking, but may not mention that it is improper to include arsenic in the recipe.

Apparently it is high time for the U.S. Supreme Court to reconsider its position and its language in the McCollum case. It owes that, I think, to the parents of American young people.

#### More Time In Israel For Christian Classes

JERUSALEM (NC) - Israel's Ministry of Education has decreed an increase in the time devoted to religion classes in secondary schools. A letter urged headmasters to make arrangements for religion teachers to take Christian students to church on Sundays (which are regular schooldays in Israel) and holy days.

### Was 1954 Integration Ruling Based Solely On Sociology?

Newspictures of teenage New Orleans mobs certainly make bad propaganda for the American way of life. What is even worse is the reporting of the bombastic, hate-filled tirades against Negroes that were delivered in the Louisiana legislature last month.

Representative Garrett declaimed, "This is total war. We must use every weapon at command." Senator Speedy Long announced that be would (if he could) vote for the impeachment of the entire Supreme Court.

In discussing Southern defiance of the Supreme Court, I find that many New Yorkers seem to have only a very vague interest in the whole question of integration and massive resistance. They feel that the 1954 integration decision is the law of the land and must be obeyed, and that troops must be sent to places like Little Rock to see that the law is obeyed.

#### LITTLE ENTHUSIASM

But apart from that, they seem to betray little or no enthusiasm for the high Court decision. Maybe the reason is that they don't like to talk about social justice because they are painfully aware that they themselves are guilty of race prejudice and discrimination. They don't want to speak about the mote in the eye of the Southern racist for fear someone might notice the beam in their own eye. At any rate, many New Yorkers seem to accept the integration decision with an air of resignation and feel that the South should do likewise.

Southerners sense this attitude that is prevalent in many parts of the North. They are persuaded that Northern support of the integration decision is only reluctant and merely verbal, a half-hearted

surrender to law just because it is law. How can we expect rabble rousers in New Orleans to change their tune if they believe the North secretly agrees with them about the innate wrongness of the de-

The notion that sticks in the craw of many New Yorke that the Supreme Court, dup it by the sociological writings of fuzzy liberals, arbitrarily ruled that segregated education cannot equal the education a Negro child receives in a classroom with whites. The fact is that the Court was anything but arbitrary. Before handing down its famous decision, it listened patiently to expert testimony.

CHANGING CONDITIONS

Men of the calibre of Dr. Frederick Wertham stated that they had found segregation created dangerous anxieties in the Negro child. Others said it increased mutual hostility and suspicion between white and Negro children, reinforced preiudices and facilitated outbreaks of racial violence. If the attorneys for the Southern states had information that would rebut this testimony, why did they not bring it forward? Why don't the Southern legislators produce this evidence today?

If you ask this question of a New Yorker, you will probably hear an answer to the effect that the Supreme Court should have stayed within the prevailing law which approved "separate but equal facilities" and should have kent its collective nose out of sociology and psychology.

It is true that the Court overruled the principle of the Plessy v Ferguson case of 1896. But reversal of a preceding decision is not at all uncommon in Supreme Court history. What should the Court do when it realizes that an old precedent applied to today's conditions vio-

He said "he who hears you (the Apostles) hears Me," and, "all authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me; you, therefore, must go out, making disciples of all nations . . . teaching them to observe all the commandments which I have given you. And behold I am with you all through the days that are coming, until the consummation of the world."

One might have anticipated that the Founder of Christianity would not leave His revelation

to the uncertain fate of spoken messages and written records alone.

To make certain of their permanence He would use obvious means. He would organize a society which would function after His death as a court of appeal to decide controversies about the meaning of His doctrine.

No document, no testament, no political constitution, however carefully it is drawn up. can fail to become a subject of misunderstanding among men. There must be an authority to render final decision, if confusion and division are to be avoided. Such a society Christ did found, and that society is the Church.

Christ's preoccupation with His Church is a prominent fact of His public life. He talks of it constantly. More important, He begins to build that Church almost from the start of His career. That career He knew

would be brief, and He knew that He must build up a group to carry on His work, to bring His truths and the means of salvation to every people of every time.

#### CHRIST STILL ABIDES

Experimentally He sent his disciples to carry His message to towns and districts that He did not Himself visit, checking upon their failures as well as their successes.

The Divine Master goes further. He identifies Himself with them. Wherever they go and whatever they do He will be with them. Time will pass, and they will die, but successors there would be to take up their tasks. Until the end of the world He will still be with the Apostles and their suc-

Today the Church, founded by Christ, still exists, animated by Him, living His life, proclaiming His message and cooperating with Him in distributing the fruits of His redemption.

#### SOUL A BATTLEFIELD

### **Attend Funeral** Of Ex-Catholic?

By MSGR. J. D. CONWAY

Q. If a Catholic who has given up his religion years ago, dies and is buried with Protestant services in a Protestant church, it would surely be permissible for the relatives of this person to attend the services, wouldn't it, out of love and respect?

A. I would think so. I don't think it would be construed as approval of his defection from the faith; and probably the obvious refusal of relatives to attend the funeral would cause much harm: ill feeling, resentment, and anger; along with the conviction that Catholics are a hard-headed, narrow-minded crowd, intolerant and unforgiving.

People are particularly sensitive at the time of a funeral, and any slight or affront in such time of sorrow is deeply felt.

Q. In view of the Doctrine of the Immaculate Conception, to what degree did the Blessed Virgin Mary share in the benefits of the Salvation and Redemption of mankind?

A. She shared more completely than any other human being. Her Immaculate Conception was made possible by the Redemption, even though it preceded the death of the Savior in time. It was in anticipation of the merits of her Divine Son that Mary was sanctified at the moment her soul was created.

\* \* \* Q. My husband and I have always been good Catholics, and now we have three children who have been raised in Catholic grade school; our two boys were altar boys. Now the oldest is 24, and would not miss Mass for anything; he has always been a good talented boy, who was never girl crazy. Now he has met a nice girl, but she is of the Evangelical faith, and she teaches Sunday school. The boy thinks a lot of her, and is making statements that he might have to change to

We are just sick about this. I have asked him not to change; but if I forbid it all he has to do is pack up and leave. He doesn't want to turn, but sometimes love is stronger than religion.

her religion to marry her.

A. I have much sympathy for you in your problem, but I don't know that I can help you much with advice. A man in love does not always use his head; and forceful action may only increase his rebellion.

I would strongly advise that the two of them go and talk to a priest about their problem. They are trying to work out the basis of a happy life together; and I cannot imagine that a good Catholic will ever be happy when he has compromised his religious convictions.



lates the very spirit of the Constitution? The Constitution is not some sort of a sacred book that must be adored and served but whose application must be the same in 1960 as in 1896.

Law exists to serve society, not society the law. The Founding Fathers left the wording of the human rights in the Constitution rather general so that the Supreme Court could adapt these principles to changing conditions. The glory of our Constitution is that it is not a dead book but a flexible, living law that

is sensitive to the needs of different times and new crises.

Did the Supreme Court decide in 1954 on the basis of sociology? Our American courts are constantly referring to all kinds of non-legal information in order to make right decisions and secure justice. How can jurists make a correct decision on social relationships such as public education unless they know the social facts? In short, in overthrowing the "separate but equal" doctrine the Court was following a noble precedent, creative interpretation of law to serve the needs of society.





GUADALAJARA, Mexico (NC) Topflight Catholic Actionists of the Americas surveyed the social and economic conditions of the peoples of Latin America and saw they were not good. They resolved to do something about it - not manana,

A communique issued at the

close of the fifth Inter-American Catholic Action week ninpointed the trouble in much of the hemisphere: "a dehumanized society."

The solution, the statement said, is the mandate of "love of God and one's fellow man and the realization that the delay of Christians in fulfilling

God's plan in time will certainly produce a materialistic and inhuman world."

The statement reviewing the findings of the 300 ecclesiastical and lay social action experts echoed a point made during the week-long meeting by Archbishop Miguel Dario Miranda of Mexico City.

#### NEED OF RELIGION

It is precisely at this point that the need of religion can be seen. Religion is intended by God to equip us with the weapons needed to conquer ourselves first and then our ene-

We can do nothing without the supernatural help of God, the grace of the sacraments and prayer. Will power alone is helpless in face of the soul's enemies and our own traitorous natures.

Some, as our Bishops have reminded us recently, try to explain away responsibility for guilt. They want to believe and have us believe that we are predetermined to do what we do. that we cannot change. Therefore, they cannot be blamed for what society may call wrong.

#### "BY WILLING IT"

No one fortunately has to remain the way he is unless he wills it. The sister of St. Thomas Aquinas once asked her brother how to become a saint and he answered: "By willing it." So with us.

The grace of God is available for everyone. It is capable of transforming character, no matter how vile the vice, how serious the handicap. But grace must be given a chance. One must be humble and persevere in the use of it. One must believe God is capable of doing with our cooperation what is impossible for us to do alone.

### First Mass Dec. 8 At Sacred Heart

OKEECHOBEE - The new Sacred Heart Church is rapidly nearing completion here, and first Masses were offered in the building on Thursday, Dec. 8.

Accommodations for 240 persons will be provided in the new church, which is under construction with the financial assistance of the Catholic Church Extension Society.

Designed by architect Thomas J. Madden, Jr., of Miami, the church also provides priests' and altarboys' sacristies and living quarters for one priest. A baptistry and confessinal will be located near the front entrance.

The present church, erected in 1921 by the Diocese of St. Augustine, can accommodate only 75 persons. According to a recent census the Catholic population is more than 400 adults and almost 200 children including migrant families who work the lakeside farmlands for nine months during the year.

The parish is now served by Father Michael Beerhalter and priests from St. Anastasia parish in Fort Pierce, 36 miles away on the east coast.

Bishop Coleman F. Carroll will confer the Sacrament of Confirmation Sunday, Dec. 18, on all adults in the diocese who wish to be confirmed in ceremonies at 3 p.m. in St. Mary Cathedral.

Any resident Catholic above high-school age who has not yet been confirmed is invited articipate at the Catheceremonies. The only requirement is that each candidate bring a written permission from his pastor both for himself and for his sponsor. Candidates will choose their

The Sacrament of Confirmation should be received by all Catholics since it is one of the most important of the seven sacraments. Through Confirmation the Holy Ghost comes in a special way to the soul, enabling Christians to profess their faith strongly and perfectly as adult soldiers of Christ. Catholics are confirmed in order to strengthem themselves against the many dangers to salvation, and to be better prepared to defend their faith in daily life.

The first Confirmation took place on Pentecost Sunday when the Holy Ghost descended upon the Apostles. Since that time it has been the

Church to confer the Sacrament on all adult members.

Confirmation can be received only once since it imparts a special indelible mark on the soul. A Bishop is the usual minister of Confirmation and the ceremony is marked with many ancient symbolisms.

After the Bishop Tays his hands over the candidates and prays for them to receive the Holy Ghost, he anoints the forehead of each one to mark him as a professed Christian who practices the faith openly. The person confirmed is then given a slight blow on the cheek to remind him he must be ready to suffer all things for the love of Christ.



### Christmas Candles Are Easy And Inexpensive To Make

Since the early days of Christianity it has been a religious practice to represent Christ the Lord by a burning candle, a custom still preserved in the liturgy of the Church.

At Christmas, a large candle symbolizing the Lord was kept burning on the eve of the feast and all through the night, a tradition which is still kept in many countries today.

Candles which are easy to make and which can be trimmed elaborately with simple and inexpensive materials are ideal as gifts as well as for use in the home. Most of the supplies needed can be found in an average home and trimmings may be almost anything from colored yarn to sequins and sea shells.

#### MATERIALS NEEDED

To start you will need household paraffin, all purpose dye (Rit) in any color you choose, ordinary string for wicks, adhesive or cellophane tape, a pencil or other small stick, glue, scissors and trimming.

A clean, empty coffee can in a larger pot of water provides an ideal and disposable container in which to melt the paraffin, but 1 regular double boiler may be used. In either case, follow directions for melting paraffin and use care that the water container does not boil dry. Never melt paraffin over direct

One pound of paraffin fills three frozen juice concentrate cans, and one pound and one half fills a quart milk carton. A centerpiece Christmas tree takes about two pounds, and each pound of paraffin requires one to two teaspoons of dry dye. Other molds which make attractive candles are muffin tins, soup cans, paper cups, paper freezer cartons, fancy molds and flower pots. Some very beautiful candles are made and left in glass brandy snifters, sherbet glasses, or shell shapes. When using glass containers warm the glass first and have the melted paraffin barely pourable to avoid cracking the glass.

#### HOW TO MAKE

Melt the paraffin as directed, stir in the proper amount of dye, remove from heat and stir thoroughly three to five minutes for good color dispersion. Let stand a few minutes while preparing the mold. Since the Rit is primarily water soluble and will not entirely dissolve, a residue which does no harm will settle at the bottom of the wax. Lighter shades of the dve such as Light Green, Scarlet, Evening Blue, Turquoise, Coral, Yellow, Chartreuse, Orchid and Pinks, produce brighter colors as they solidify.

When wax has cooled slightly, pour into chosen mold very slowly and carefully. Then let stand until solid. Milk carton candles, for example, take eight to 10 hours to harden completely.

prepare molds, punch small hole in bottom center of can or carten. Run string down through hole, extending it about three inches, secure the bottom end with tape and dribble some wax over it to completely seal the hole. Draw string to top of carton and tie it tautly around a pencil or stick braced across the top.


#### TO ACHIEVE GLITTER

For muffin tins, and other molds in which you do not wish to punch a hole, cut string in lengths at least an inch longer than the depth of the mold. Dip these into the hot, colored paraffin and set aside to harden for later use. They can be pushed into place when the candle begins to harden.

Unmolding is simple. Paper molds are stripped from the candle. Metal or glass molds should be dipped quickly in very hot water to loosen, then the candle can be gently shaken out. To achieve glitter throughout the candle. wait until most of the wax

small amount on wax paper and let cool until firm but not really hard. Cut out holly leaf shapes with a sharp knife. Lift from paper and warm over a flame, working with just one leaf at a time. Curl the edges for a truly naturalistic look and stick the leaves to the candle in troups of three. Holly berries can be made of Coral tinted paraffin.

Glitter and other decorations should be applied with household cement. Poster paint may be used by adding liquid detergent to the paint or by rubbing the wet brush on a bar of soap before dipping it in paint. This makes the paint stick to the

# Shy Teenager Worries About Her Future

I'm a heartbroken teenage girl (17) with a problem. I've almost given up ever getting married. I'm the plainest of five girls and am extremely thin and wear glasses. I pray to forget my bitterness, but sometimes I have to face the facts. I don't keep company with my friends very much because I do not like the crowd at much. Can you help me?

It seems to me, Betty, you've given up your inalienable right to "life, liberty, and the pursuit" before you ever reached the age to use it. Why not give yourself half a chance? I know that some girls in our society feel quite mature at 17 — in fact, about one out of every seven getting married are this age — but you still face some sixty more years of life. Aren't you pulling out of the competition rather early in the race?

You say you have to face the facts. All right, let's face them. At present you're considered the plainest of five. How do you know? Well, your sisters are always being told how attractive they are. I realize that this must be very hard to take, but what does it really mean?

Perhaps your sisters are older than you or have developed physically more rapidly. Both boys and girls show a wide span of age-differences at which they start to "blossom out." Of course it's rough to be considered the "plain one" but remember this is a temporary, passing matter.

#### Compared To Her Sisters

It is also a temporary matter that you now feel in competition with your sisters or, at least, constantly compare yourself with them. When you reach maturity, you will be accepted for what you are in yourself. It's what you have made of yourself that will count, so don't fall into the silly habit of always comparing yourself with your sisters, particularly when the comparison may be based on the thoughtless comments of others

But I'm so extremely thin! Are you really, or is this just in comparison with your sisters? Most girls your age are starting to run into the opposite problem — too many pounds, or too many in the wrong places! However, if you happen to be unusually thin, you might check your diet.

Some young people acquire strange eating habits. Following their imagination rather than their normal appetite, they insist there's a whole category of foods they don't like or "just can't eat."

Much of this is sheer infantile fancy. Stick to a well-balanced diet — if you're in doubt about what foods are needed, check with your home economics teacher or counselor. If you're the kind that skips breakfast regularly, change the habit right now, and give your growing system a break. Also, get plenty of exercise and at least eight hours of sleep. Of course, if you really are just "skin and bones," you should consult a doctor since your growing body may require additional vitamins or changes in your usual diet.

#### Fear To Be Different

You say you wear glasses. Well, so do a good many other people, both young and old; and I might add, a good many others should be wearing them. Now I know glasses can be a bit a nuisance at times, particularly during games and sports, let's face it. If the type of glasses you wear are suitably on, most people around you don't really notice them.

Young people are sometimes so sensitive about wearing glasses because they fear to be different, but at 17 you should be growing out of this insecure stage of utter dependence on others. Glasses will mean no more or less than what you make them mean. People react to you, not to your glasses, and it is only because you lack confidence in yourself, that you see your glasses or your figure as obstacles to popularity.

Remember, it is you, the entire you as a person, your whole personality, that must be attractive. Individual items take their meaning from the total, unique self that you are.

This brings up a final point — to be loved, you must be lovable. You say you don't keep company with friends very much because you don't like the crowd that much. But if you don't make an effort to like them, how can you expect them to like you? We become lovable only by loving, because love is not a one-way street, but a mutual giving and receiving — and the giving comes first. An important part of growing up

to overcome the childish expectancy to receive, and to sarn to give. When you're with others, try to see what you an give, and what you can contribute to the happiness of others.

In practice this means that you take an active interest in



others, in their feelings, problems, views, and concerns. You learn to listen, to observe reactions, and to gauge feelings. Soon you discover that others are very much like yourself. They need support, affection, encouragement, and understanding. They have their doubts, their fears, their human insecurities, but also their hopes, desires and aspirations. In fact, they're very much like yourself. Seek to give when you're with your friends and you'll like them, you'll receive — and you'll be attractive!






### La Visita del **Doctor Fisher** a Su Santidad

# S. S. el Papa Ruega por el Pueblo Haitiano

CIUDAD DEL VATICANO. (NC)-La Santa Sede ha hecho llegar al gobierno de Haití su protesta por las medidas que ese gobierno antillano adoptó contra el arzobispo de Puerto Principe.

El arzobispo, Mons. Francois Poirier, fue expulsado de Haití el 24 de noviembre. Al tomar el avión en Puerto Príncipe llevaba solamente lo puesto, su cruz pectoral, su pasaporte y un dólar que le había dado un sacerdote.

Fue detenido por seis gendarmes y seis agentes de la policía secreta, quienes le condujeron al avión de la línea de Miami. Desde esta ciudad de la Florida el arzobispo siguió viaje a New York para continuar por vía aérea a Francia, su tierra natal, a donde llegó el 26 de noviem-

El gobierno del presidente haitiano, Froncois Duvalier acusa al arzobispo de supuesta complicidad con grupos estudiantiles comunistas y de ' darles 7,000 dólares.

Mons. Poirier niega rotundamente tales cargos y afirma que su expulsión es un episodio más de la acción constante contra la Iglesia que realiza el régimen de Duvalier.

La protesta de la Santa Sede fue presentada por conducto diplomático. En ella, según L'Osservatore, se subraya la "gravedad del incidente, que ha causado honda pesadum-

El periódico de la Ciudad del Vaticano recordó que Haití mantiene relaciones diplomáticas con la Santa Sede e incluso ha suscrito un concordato, todavía en vigor, por lo que parece inexplicable que se haya producido allí tal acto de violencia, "cuyas conseeuencias no pueden ignorar los responsables."

"L'Osservatore recordó también que en agosto de 1959, cuando el gobierno haitiano dictó orden de detención contra Mons. Poirier -no llevada entonces a efecto—, advirtió que el derecho canónico determina la excomunión de aquellos que impiden a los obispos el libre de ejercicio de su potestad.

Duvalier es un médico católico que tomó la presidencia de Haiti en septiembre de 1957, para un período de seis años. Su antecesor, Paul Magloire, fue derrocado y tuvo que salir del país en diciembre del año anterior.

nando el Papa Pío IX, en ho 1854, definió el dogma de la Inmaculada Concepción, no hizo sino ratificar con el poder de su supremo magisterio una verdad que fue siempre reconocida por la Tradición cristiana, por el sentimiento popular y por los escritos de los Padres y Doctores de la Iglesia.

Cuando se disponía a recoger unas ramas secas, se vió envuelta en una ráfaga misteriosa. Miró enfrente, hacia la roca agujereada y un grito de de sorpresa quedó anudado a su garganta. Ella mismo nos dice lo que vió: "Alcé los ojos, miré hacia un hueco de la peña y ví que se movía un rosal silvestre que había a la entrada, mas no los zarzales de su lado. Advertí luego en el hueco un resplandor y en seguida apareció sobre el rosal una mujer hermosísima, vestida de blanco, la cual me saludó inclinando la cabeza..., yo me hubiera quedado mirándola toda la vida."

Cuando en posteriores apariciones Bernardita le pide a la hermosísima mujer de la aparición, que le diga quién es, ove esta seis palabras "Yo soy la Inmaculada Concepción."

WASHINGTON, (NC) —Su Santidad el Papa Juan XXIII envió a los Obispos norteamericanos un mensaje de elogio y agradecimiento por la ayuda que prestan al catolicismo latinoamericano.

La carta del Padre Santo fue leída durante la asamblea anual del Episcopado, recién celebrada aquí en la Universidad Católica de América.

El Soberano Pontífice mencionó especialmente la la bor de caridad que realiza el Servicio Católico de Auxilio NCWC, agencia mundial de socorro patrocinada por los Obispos de Estados Unidos.

Su Santidad afirma que la jerarquía de este país ha dado "prueba evidente" de caridad fraterna, al llevar a efecto "con muy amplia generosidad" sus esperanzas de asistencia en favor de la causa católica en Latinoamérica.

El documento recuerda expresamente la ayuda a los seminarios y seminaristas, y los socorros enviados a Chile tras los terremotos sufridos por ese país suramericano.

A la asamblea episcopal asistieron los cardenales Francis Spellman, arzobispo de Nueva York; James Francis McIntyre, arzobispo de Los Angeles; Richard Cushing, arzobispo de Boston, Albert Meyer, arzobispo de Chicago, más otros 28 arzobispos y 150 obispos, entre ellos Mons. Jaime Davis, arzobispo de San Juan y Mons. Luis Aponte Martínez, obispo auxiliar de Ponce. Puerto Rico.

Los arzobispos de Detroit y Milwaukee, Mons. John F. Daerden y Mons. William E. Cousins respectivamente, fueron designados para la Junta de Gobierno de la National Catholic Welfare Conference; Mons. Dearden como director episcopal del Departamento de la Juventud y Mons. Cousins para el mismo puesto en el de Acción Social.

# Protestan Católicos Cubanos Ante El Crecimiento de Calumnias

LA HABANA, (NC)—Las Organizaciones Católicas Nacionales han protestado contra la campaña oficial de "calumnias" que desata contra instituciones de la Iglesia el égimen de Fidel Castro.

También Mons. Enrique Pérez Serantes, arzobispo de Santiago, protestó enérgicamente contra la ola de violencia provocada por organizaciones fidelistas contra la lectura de su reciente pastoral sobre "Roma o Moscú".

Cualquier agresión contra la universidad católica o su rector será considerada como un ataque a todo el catolicismo cubano y a la libertad de enseñanzas, advierten las OCN, una federación de trece asociaciones con más de 20,000 militantes y un amplio radio de influencia en toda la Isla.

El g obierno ha aumentado sus ataques por la prensa y por medio de grupos estudiantiles, contra la Universidad Católica de Villanueva aquí, y su rector Mons. Eduardo Boza Masvidal, obispo auxiliar de La Habana.

"Se trata de una campaña intensa y sistemática de difamación pública, que se vale de la calumnia y la mentira con el fin de destruír su prestigio ante la sociedad cubana", dicen las OCN.

"No podemos ignorar la gravedad de estos ataques, que ponen en peligro la existencia misma de una institución de enseñanza de nivel universitario", existencia que es un derecho reconocido en todos los países del mundo que "no sean los llamados socialistas, dominados por el comunismo totalitario."

Los ataques del gobierno cobran mayor significado en vista del control absoluto que ejerce sobre las demás universidades del país, por medio de purgas de profesores y de líderes estudiantiles.

Los católicos cubanos, dice la hoja profusamente divulgada en la Isla, consideran
toda agresión "directa o indirecta (contra la universidad o su rector) como un
ataque injustificado contra la
Iglesia, contra la integridad
de sus instituciones de educación, y contra los principios
de libertad de enseñanza".

Por su parte Mons. Pérez Serantes declaró que "recibimos con alegría el momento de sufrir abusos en nombre de Jesús". Su circular leída en las iglesias de la arquidiócesis de Santiago, llama "vergonzosos e insolentes" los desórdenes provocados por milicias y turbas fidelistas alrededor de su Catedral cuando hace pocos domingos los sacerdotes leyeron su pastoral contra el comunismo. En ella hacía una defensa de la

justícia social y de los derechos de los pobres.

"Protestamos con toda energía y dignidad —dice Mons, Pérez Serantes— contra estos procedimientos agresivos e injustos".

En el mismo fin de esmana el primer ministro de Cuba, Fidel Castro, renovó sus ataques a la Iglesia en un discurso pronunciado en la escalinata de la Universidad de La Habana, para aseverar que habir sacerdote pagados por latifundistas con la consigna de predicar contra su revolución.

Después de la nacionalización de las plantaciones de ca ña de azúcar, dijo, se descubrió en los libros de contabilidad que los curas de la región recibían dinero de los antiguos propietarios.

"Fidel ....; dure con los curas!", fue el grito de la muchedumbre de milicianos y estudiantes.

Aunque el orador trató de presentar a los sacerdotes como cómplices contra el pueblo, lo cierto es que fue costumbre tradicional en varias plantaciones de Cuba proveer escuelas, capillas y servicios médicos a los trabajadores y sus familias. La administración giraba algunos fondos a los encargados, como maestros, sacerdotes y médicos.

Castro habló también de "criminales en sotana... que escriben sermones contrarre-volucionarios y hojas parro-quiales".

En su discurso, interrumpido por dos explosiones de
petardos, Castro llamó despectivamente a la Universidad
de Villanueva "Yanquilandia"
(fue fundada por Padre Agustinos de Filadelfia) y de sergundo arremetió contra los
"centros de alta cultura que
dirigen las clases super - privilegiadas... que predican el
odio de clases y de patria."

### Saints of the Week

Sunday, Dec. 11

Third Sunday of Advent. Generally this date is the feast of St. Damasus I, Pope-Confessor. He was a native of Rome and attended Pope Liberius in exile. He succeeded Pope Liberius. He commissioned St. Jerome to correct the Latin text of the Holy Scriptures. St. Damasus is famous for having restored and beautified in Rome the tombs of the martyrs. He died in 384 at the age of 80.

#### Monday, Dec. 12

Our Lady of Guadalupe. This feast commemorates the apparition of the Blessed Mother to a humble Indian, Juan Diego, in 1531 on Tepeyac hill near Mexico City. The great Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe now stands on the spot of the apparition. Pope Benedict XV decreed Our Lady of Guadalupe as patroness of Mexico.

#### Tuesday, Dec. 13

St. Lucy of Syracuse, Virgin-Martyr. She was a Sicilian and one of the most famous of the martyrs put to death under Dioceltian about 304. She is commemorated daily in the Canon of the Mass. While Christians were being sought out, she distributed her wealth to the poor and was denounced by a young noble to whom her mother wished to give her in marriage. She endured tortures at Syracuse and was put to death by a sword driven through her throat.

#### Wednesday, Dec. 14

St. Nicasius and Companions, Martyrs. St. Nisasius was Bishop of Rheims. With his sister, St. Eutropia, and a number of the clergy and faithful, he was put to death for the Faith by barbarians who invaded Gaul about 407.

#### Thursday, Dec. 15

St. Irenaeus and Companions, Martyrs. They were a group of 22 martyrs who were put to death for the Faith about 258 in the Valerian persecution. Included in the numbers were SS.

Anthony, Theodore, Saturnius and Victor.

#### Friday, Dec. 16

St. Eusebius, Bishop-Martyr. He was the scion of a noble family of Sardinia. He was taken to Rome by his mother, where he was ordained. He served the Church at Vercelli and was the choice of clergy and laity when the episcopal chair became vacant. He fought courageously against the Arian heretics, who had him banished to Syria, where he underwent many hardships. He returned to Vercelli under the reign of Julian and died in 370. He is revered as a martyr because of the hardships he suffered.

#### Saturday, Dec. 17

St. Lazarus, Bishop-Confessor. He was the disciple and friend of Christ, who was raised from the dead by Our Lord. It is belived that with his sisters, Mary and Martha, he journeyed into Gaul and was the first Apostle of southern France, becoming Bishop of Marseilles. He is the patron saint of that city.

### New de Paul Group Installs


A new conference of the St. Vincent de Paul Society, established in St. Timothy Parish, formally installed its officers at ceremonies on Nov. 29.

#### 2 French-Made Films Condemned By Legion

NEW YORK (NC) - Two French - made movies, "Come Dance With Me" and "Love Game," have been condemned by the National Legion of Decency.

At the same time the legion announced a change of classification from Class C (condemned) to Class B (morally objectionable in part for all) for the movie "Private Lives of Adam and Eve," produced by Universal earlier this year but never shown publicly.

The legion said substantial revisions made in the film warranted the reclassification.

The legion posted the following objection against "Come Dance With Me": "In addition to grossly suggestive costuming, dialogue and situations pervading its development this film presents certain subject material in a manner which is morally unacceptable for entertainment purposes."

The legion said the movie "Love Game" "is seriously offensive to Judaeo - Christian standards of morality and decency."

ents, teeners, teachers, movie club members, writers - no matter what our age group or social status, work together to make our Pledge stick. Post the Legion lists in the schools, club-rooms and Church vestibules. Let every one of us consult these lists and choose our movies only by Legion recommendations.

Let us patronize theaters where the better programs are shown, stay away from those where objectionable pictures are booked and let us inform the theater managements what we are doing. There are in the USA enough' practicing Catholics to turn this evil tide.

HYPOCRISY AND DUPLICITY

Our Bishops have called upon the Hollywood movie business to "desist from that hypocrisy and duplicity whereby it self-righteously hides from public censure behind a Code which is presently largely ineffective."

The film industry's only reply so far is a feeble: "We do not agree . . . the spirit of the Code continues to be maintained." Completely ignoring the Bishops' constructive, four-point plan for improvement, the Association of Motion Picture Producers, makes the unqualified and untrue statement that within the past year "not one American film was condemned."

In fact three American films were condemned. "Duke" Wales, press relations chief for


the Producers Association tells me that this claim was intended to indicate that no American film made by one of the Association's members was condemned Even this is not true





#### THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

### **Last Of The Prophets**

Father Hubert Dunphy received his Master's degree from Fordham University. "Christmas Every Christmas" is his third book. The others are "The Virtues Revisited" (1958) and "In Blood Burnt Footsteps" (1960). His articles have appeared in several magazines and he was recently appointed editor of "Friars Fields."

John the Baptist was a strangely wonderful and mysterious character. A kinsman of Christ, his entire life was spent in close connection with the God-Man. He was a highly privileged person over whom Christ shed some of His own mystery and magic.

Several striking parallels between the life of Jesus and John the Baptist suggest themselves: the same angel announces their births, both are born without original sin, both live a secluded life in preparation for public careers, both preach penance, both are executed because they incite the wrath of those rightfully condemned.

The father of John the Baptist was Zachary; his mother, Elizabeth. They had grown old without having children and, like any Jewish couple of that time, they bore their stigma with heavy disappointment.

Zachary was a priest and one day when he was offering incense in the Temple the archangel Gabriel appeared to him and said he would yet have a son. Moreover, this son was to become someone quite special. he was to be the forerunner and precursor of the Messias.

#### STRUCK DUMB

Unfortunately, Zachary made the mistake of asking for a sign to confirm the authenticity of the angel's message. Did he really doubt the angel's word? Or, in requesting verification, was he merely acting as other good men, such as Abraham and Moses, had acted in similar circumstances?

We don't know what Zachary's motives were, but we know that he got a sign all right, and one that literally left him speechless. Zachary was struck dumb for more than nine months until his son was born.

From the beginning, this child of Zachary and Elizabeth was extraordinary. When Mary came to visit her cousin Elizabeth. John the Baptist leapt in his mother's womb when he recognized the unborn Christ.

#### BORN WITHOUT SIN

John was sanctified while still in the womb and so was born without original sin - although he was not conceived without original sin. Most of his young manhood he spent in solitude in the desert, preparing by prayer and mortification for his great vocation. He lived a most austere life, wearing a crude garb common to the nomadic shepherds (a rough cloak of camel skin) and eating locusts and wild honey.

About six months before our Lord appeared in public, John began to preach. He had one theme: Repent, change

your way of thinking, for the kingdom of God is at hand. Unlike the previous false prophets, John's preaching was so sincere and had such a strong moral tone that he attracted a large audience enough, at least, to incur the jealousy of the Pharisees.

Later, when his own followers complained of the popularity of Jesus, John said bluntly that he was to decrease while Christ was to increase. He said he was not worthy to untie the sandals of Christ. When our Lord came to be baptized by John, it took some convincing by Him before John could be persuaded to perform that symbolic act.

#### BEHEADED BY HEROD

Toward the end of his time, John denounced King Herod for living in adultery with his brother's wife, Herodias. As his reward for publicizing this embarrassing fact, John was clapped into prison. That was not enough for Herodias. She knew John was her enemy and would not rest until she had his head.

Before his execution, John sent two of his disciples to ask Jesus if He was really the Messias. However, it was not Christ's plan to make a declaration at this time. Most of the Jews were expecting a military messias who would deliver them by fire and sword from the bondage of the hated Romans. Christ was hard at work chipping away at this petrified error; He planned to reveal His spiritual messiasship only gradually.

Even with His precursor in prison and soon to be beheaded, Jesus could not give this friend and kinsman the satisfaction of a definite answer.

#### NONE GREATER

He did point to His miracles as implicit proof of His divinity and He did perform some miracles just for the occasion.

Jesus said: "Go and report to John what you have heard and seen: the blind see, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead rise, the poor have the Gospel preached to them."

"As the messengers were leaving, Christ gave John his final mead of praise: "Amen I say to you, among those born of women there has not risen a greater than John the Baptist." If John or his disciples needed any more proof, this must have been enough.

John the Baptist was more of a hero than we suspect because he was expendable and he knew it. He saw his situation clearly, agreed to accept the role, and bowed his head in humility before the divine command. He died in jail at the whim of a sinful woman, a total failure in the eyes of his contemporaries.
