Dr. Vandana Shiva, author, renowned environmental activist and winner of the Right Livelihood Award (the “alternative Nobel Prize”), is the founder of Navdanya, a movement to protect biological and cultural diversity and food security that has helped create the largest direct marketing, fair trade organic network in India (www.navdanya.org).

Dr. Mira Shiva, physician, public health activist and founding member of the worldwide People’s Health Movement (www.phmovement.org), has devoted three decades to issues of primary health care; the right to health, food and essential medicines; and gender and social justice.
