
# STU Faces of Diversity








# April Art Gallery Opening

Who was James O'Mailia?

O'Mailia, for the current STU student, is most likely abuilding were most of the business and religion classes are taught, or the top competitive scholarship involvesfull coverage in tuition, books, and room and board for a period of two years. But for some individuals, professor Raleigh or Dr. Conley, O'Mailia was better known as Jimmy, their colleague and friend. James O'Mailia was born in Midland, Pennsylvania on November 20th 1915. He graduated from Canisus College in 1939. He served overseas with the US Army during World War II. After an honorable discharge, O'Mailia travel to Lima-Peru where he received his



degree at the oldest university of America: Universidad de San Marcos. It was at this time were he met the love of his live, Yolanda. After married, the O'mailia family moved to Havana-Cuba. Almost a decade after moving to Cuba and while he was currently teaching English at St. Thomas of Villanova (after the Bay of Pigs invasion), he was arrested with several members of the faculty of the university. After surviving three months of imprisonment under inhuman conditions at a Cuban jail, he moved to Miami to meet his family and continued his doctrine at Biscayne College (now St. Thomas). O'Mailia taught English, Spanish, Speech, and Business Writing at St. Thomas. He held every significant position including Director of Admissions, Academic Dean, Chairman of the faculty Forum, and Chairman of the Tenure Committee. O'Mailia or Mr. O as his students remember, was the soul of St. Thomas life. He was the one that started the pool, the rat, and several inter-dormitory parties (as some people remember: The best Host a party can have). He was one of the most beloved teachers of all time. The classroom for O'Mailia, as professor Raleigh remembers, "was what fresh mountain air after a hard climb or a chord from a Debussy nocturne or a million dollars in the bank might be to some other man." James O'Mailia died of a heart attack in 1984. One of his last words before he left St. Thomas were "If teaching was the best thing to do, Biscayne was the best place to do it." James O'Mailia died, but his spirit is still alive and will remain in the St. Thomas community to continue touching the souls of all of us as long as St. Thomas University or Biscayne college exists. #### In Memoriam of John H. Bradley


Founder of the tourism and hospitality program at STU, Dr. Bradley spent a total of 31 years between STU and Universidad de Santo Thomas de Villanueva in Cuba. Having grown up in Conyers, GA, he attended the University of Georgia for his undergraduate degree in business. He first went to Cuba in 1950 to obtain his masters' degree from Villanueva. After graduating, he remained at Villanueva as professor of English until Castro's forces closed the university in 1961. Arrested on the day of the Bay of Pigs invasion, Bradley spent three months in prison along with another STU/Villanueva professor Dr. James O'Mailia. Together with 150 other prisoners, they slept on the floor of the prison dungeons. "Afterwards I Couldn't Sleep in a bed for a long time", said Dr. Bradley.He remained in Cuba until 1962. When he realized there would be no immediate change in the political situation, he moved with family to Kingston, Jamaica to teach at the college of Art, Science and Technology. In 1968 he joined the Jamaica Tourist Board and spend the next ten years traveling throughout the island promoting tourist attractions. This experience led him to begin STU's Tourism and Hospitality Management program when he arrived in 1978. He was eventually appointed chair of the Department of Business Administration. Dr. Bradley died by cancer soon after his retirement in the year 2000.
