Students should be able to access their high school records and acquire the evaluation report from their institution. Individuals may collaborate with the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) and can request an employment evaluation through their case manager.

Please include your Individualized Education Program (IEP) and the most recent assessment in your application packet.

- 3. **Verification of Graduation Documentation**: Participants in the Bobcat Pathways program and the Bobcat Trailblazer 2 work are required to submit proof of high school graduation. All students must provide a copy of their diploma or certificate, as well as a copy of their transcript, to verify high school completion. Kindly ensure that your school transcript is included with your application packet.
- 4. **Letters of Recommendation**: Please request two individuals to provide letters of recommendation for your application to the Center of Learning Differences. Consider selecting personal references, such as employers, educators, or individuals familiar with you, who can provide insights into your character and capabilities.
