# Application Procedure for the LL.M. in Intercultural Human Rights

In order to be considered for admission to the Master of Laws Program in Intercultural Human Rights at St. Thomas University School of Law, the applicant must provide all necessary information and records as noted below. The Admissions Committee will only consider complete applications.

## **Check List of Required Documents:**

- ➤ A completed and signed application form.
- ➤ Personal Statement: please prepare an essay of two pages in which you set forth your reasons for desiring to participate in the Master of Laws in Intercultural Human Rights program. Also, please describe your goals related to the field. Reflect upon your experiences, activities, and the individuals who have influenced you. The Admissions Committee will use your essay solely for the purpose of evaluating your candidacy for admission and will hold all statements in strict confidence.
- ➤ A current resume (curriculum vitae).
- ➤ Official transcripts from all colleges/universities attended as an undergraduate or graduate student. Applicants who attended foreign institutions must have the equivalent of U.S. Bachelor's or J.D. degrees. This has to be proved either by original transcripts sent by the education institution directly to St. Thomas University School of Law LL.M. Program in Intercultural Human Rights, or otherwise by certified copies of foreign diplomas and transcripts. All foreign diplomas and transcripts should be translated in English and certified or notarized.
- ➤ All foreign credentials will have to be evaluated by a recognized foreign credentials agency in the United States. Contact us for details and names of such approved agencies.
- ➤ Two letters of recommendation, preferably from your professors, or otherwise from your present employer.
- A non-refundable application fee of fifty (\$50.00) payable in U.S. funds to St. Thomas University School of Law. Upon request, the application fee could be waived in certain circumstances.
- ➤ Interview in person or through a conference call.
- ➤ International Applicants should consult the Admissions Committee for additional documentation that might be required in order to study in the U.S.

### **Application Deadlines**

Admission to the Master of Laws in Intercultural Human Rights is on rolling basis. Prospective students may apply starting October through June. There are limited seats in the program. The Admissions Committee will make a decision on admission, placing in waitlist or rejection of the applicant within two weeks of receipt of complete application.
